Figure 1. Overall LTCF COVID-19 outbreaks since March 2021 in Utah




Figure 2. Number of positive cases among LTCF staff before and after introduction of the COVID-19 vaccine in Utah.




Figure 3. Daily count of LTC resident and staff cases.




Figure 4. Average percentage of fully vaccinated LTCF residents and staff in Utah based on NHSN data.


